It isn't **BIG** to make

Clerical subcommittee sets clear outreach agenda for 2012 – the year of bargaining

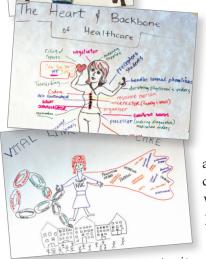
Since our last issue of *PaperWork* in November 2011, the clerical subcommittee got back down to business

in January to look at the year ahead and prioritize our outreach objectives for 2012.

At the forefront for clerical workers this year, of

course, is bargaining. Our current collective agreement expires on March 31. In September, we had our pre-bargaining occupational conference and many clerical workers were also delegates to the Facilities Bargaining Conference in November. We're happy to report that the clerical team's bargaining priorities were supported at the bargaining conference and we have representation on the FBA Bargaining Committee.

During the two-day occupational conference, HEU's clerical team - which represents 22 per cent of the union's membership in 87 job classifications - shared stories about their often "invisible" work, and spoke candidly about their workplace challenges - such as heavy workloads, inconsistent practices across health authorities (benchmarks, vacation approvals, skills and education, job duties), poor communication,

programs.

health and safety issues (including ergonomics), and outdated equipment/computer

Clerical workers also talked a lot about harassment and bullying on the job. Your subcommittee feels closely connected to the anti-bullying problem because it's clearly an issue for our members. During the conference, the union conducted a workplace bullying survey. Of the clerical workers surveyed, 93 per cent of them reported that they have either been bullied or witnessed bullying in the workplace. So, it is a big issue for clerical workers, and we will continue to campaign and raise awareness about this

Other areas your subcommittee looked at, included more

education on understanding the collective agreement, workplace rights such as workload, changes to WorkSafeBC regulations (which is about to add stress-related illness, such as harassment and bullying, to be included as a compensable claim).
