We need to win:

- living wages;
- affordable and safe housing;
- pay equity to close the wage gap (of 71¢ on the male dollar);
- national, public child care and early learning programs;
- equal access to Employment Insurance;
- access to justice, including the resources to challenge in court governments' actions, and legal aid;
- support for women's centres, shelters, rape crisis centres, and front-line advocacy and support; and
- support and protection in law for women who report sexual assault.

This December 6, please distribute HEU's annual National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence against Women sticker to members to wear.

And please contact your provincial MLA and federal MP to demand that they make women's social and economic equality a priority by supporting the initiatives listed above.
