DIWALI

Bargaining

Sister Mary Jetko and Brother Tommy Liu were selected to be on the Bargaining Resolutions Committee. And at the Facilities Bargaining Conference, Sister Ami Dosanj and Brother Tommy Liu were both elected as alternates to the Provincial Bargaining Team.

Sister Mabel Walcott attended the Patient Care Bargaining Conference this past fall. "The unity, strength and strong passion were felt physically and emotionally by each member present' said Walcott.

CUPE Convention

Sister Cora Mojica and Sister Teresita Dechavez both attended the CUPE National Convention which was held in Vancouver in November this year.

Convention was good. "Only when we have democratic control of the economy will we have an economy that works for the people".

Sister Cora spoke on resolution 193 about the Living Wage Campaign. This resolution was submitted by HEU.

"As a first time delegate, it was an honour and privilege to be selected to

attend this convention. It's so exciting to meet members from different provinces, locals and job sectors" said Mojica.

Meetings

The Standing Committee has met twice since the Equity Conference which was in March of this year. Some of the items discussed were Translation notices for local union meetings, Terms of Reference, CUPE Convention, HEU Convention for next year, March 21 International Day for the Elimination of Racism, News Letter, 2012 Budget, Equity at Regional Meetings, Clear Language issues, Living Wage Campaign, Inclusive Leadership Training, and updating our cookbook.

Translation Notices

Our newest project is the translation notices for union meetings at locals. We have translated the words "Notice of Meeting" into five different languages: Tagalog, Punjabi, Chinese (both contemporary and traditional), and Spanish. The notice also states that the meetings will be held in English.
