CUPE delegates pass resolution condemning health employers, BC Liber

Government's 'vicious attack' on health care workers can't be tolerated, union says

ORE THAN 500 delegates at this week's annual convention of CUPE-BC voted unanimously yesterday for an emergency resolution that condemns health employers and the BC Liberal government while reaffirming the union's support for HEU in its fight for fairness and protection of health care.

The resolution, which received a strong endorsement from CUPE-BC president Barry O'Neill, also calls for delegates to commit to mobilizing members in their locals for such actions as may be necessary to assist HEU.

"The CUPE Health Services Division -Hospital Employees' Union (HEU) has been under an unprecedented attack by the provincial government and its agent the Health Employers' Association of BC (HEABC) for the past three years," the resolution begins.

With nearly 7,000 HEU/CUPE members

losing their jobs to privatization an tracting out, "and thousands of more bers' jobs currently on the chopping HEABC deserves condemnation for ually refusing to consider union pr on job security in the current round tract negotiations.

The resolution to condemn HEABC provincial government follows an cent strike vote by HEU/CUPE m and HEABC's intransigent refusal contracting out on hold or withdraw their concession demands during me that they requested."
