Fraser Health hard hit by Campbell's cuts

Since 2001, the Campbell Liberals' cuts, closures and privatization agenda have severely compromised health care for patients and residents in British Columbia.

The Fraser Health Authority (FHA) shut-down 12 long-term care facilities, closed Saint Mary's Hospital in New Westminster, axed 457 acute care beds – more than any other health authority – eliminated 502 long-term care beds, and downsized or downgraded several of its health care facilities.

And more than 1,100 skilled, experienced health care workers from Hope to White Rock lost their jobs to the privatization of laundry, retail food, security and housekeeping services throughout the health authority.

The largest privatization deal saw 800 cleaning staff fired when a five-

year, \$77 million contract was handed over to a French-based corporation – Sodexho – who then hired fewer staff at about half the wage.

These privatized cleaners have heavier workloads, minimal benefits, no job security and inadequate training, placing them at increased risk for needlestick and other occupational injuries.

Over the past two years, growing concerns about hospital infection control and patient gridlock in emergency and acute care – in particular, at Surrey Memorial – eventually led to the firing of Fraser Health CEO Bob Smith.

And last spring, more than 6,000 front-line staff in the FHA took another blow when the BC Liberals imposed a collective agreement and a 15% wage rollback on the province's health care workers.

What about the rest of BC?
