Every year, there is the hope that the issue of violence against women and girls will be addressed and the incidents reduced. Yet every year, the issue and its contributing factors – economic inequality, societal attitudes, inadequate preventative, response and remedial resources – remain.

HEU's 2013 December 6 poster prompts us to really *look* and *see* what is happening around us to co-workers, family members, friends and neighbours. Because action really does begin with us. Only then can we act together to end the violence.
